Position Summary

This is a temporary, part-time position to working to enhance access to civil legal services by isolated, older adults who are especially vulnerable to housing insecurity, fraud, exploitation, and abuse. The Outreach Specialist is responsible for the development and implementation of an outreach program targeted to organizations which serve older adults in Miami-Dade County to educate them about the Elder Risk Detector Tool, its benefits, how to overcome barriers to its use, and how to use it to connect older adults to civil legal aid services. Part of the job is administrative, although a significant portion of the work involves interacting with older adult providers, caregivers, and collaborative partners. The Outreach Specialist works in close collaboration with the Project Attorney.

Functions and Responsibilities

- In collaboration with Project Attorney develop a Project outreach plan. Periodically assess plan implementation and modify as required to achieve plan goals.
- Develop, maintain, and cultivate relationships with agencies which serve older adults, caregivers, and collaborative partners.
- Schedule outreach, training, technical assistance, and consultation sessions targeted to older adult service providers and caregivers.
- Coordinate internal and external information-sharing and communication with stakeholders and Project partners.
- Produce collateral materials such as PowerPoint presentations, training materials, handouts, flyers, checklists, and brochures.
- Participate in outreach efforts including event attendance and giving presentations.
- Collect and maintain Project data and contribute to the drafting of Project reports.
